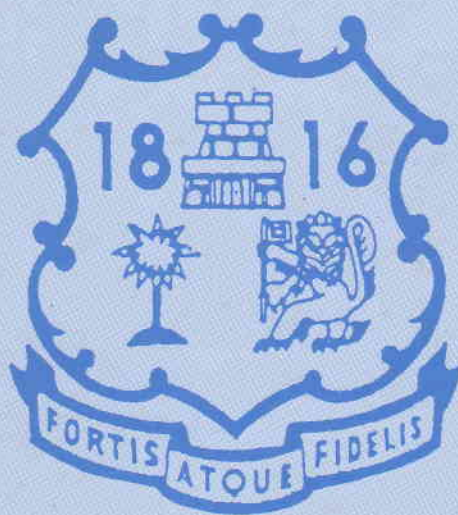


FOREWORD

At my age I still count among my blessings that I was privileged to be a pupil in the Free School. I am sure this is how all old 'Frees' feel.

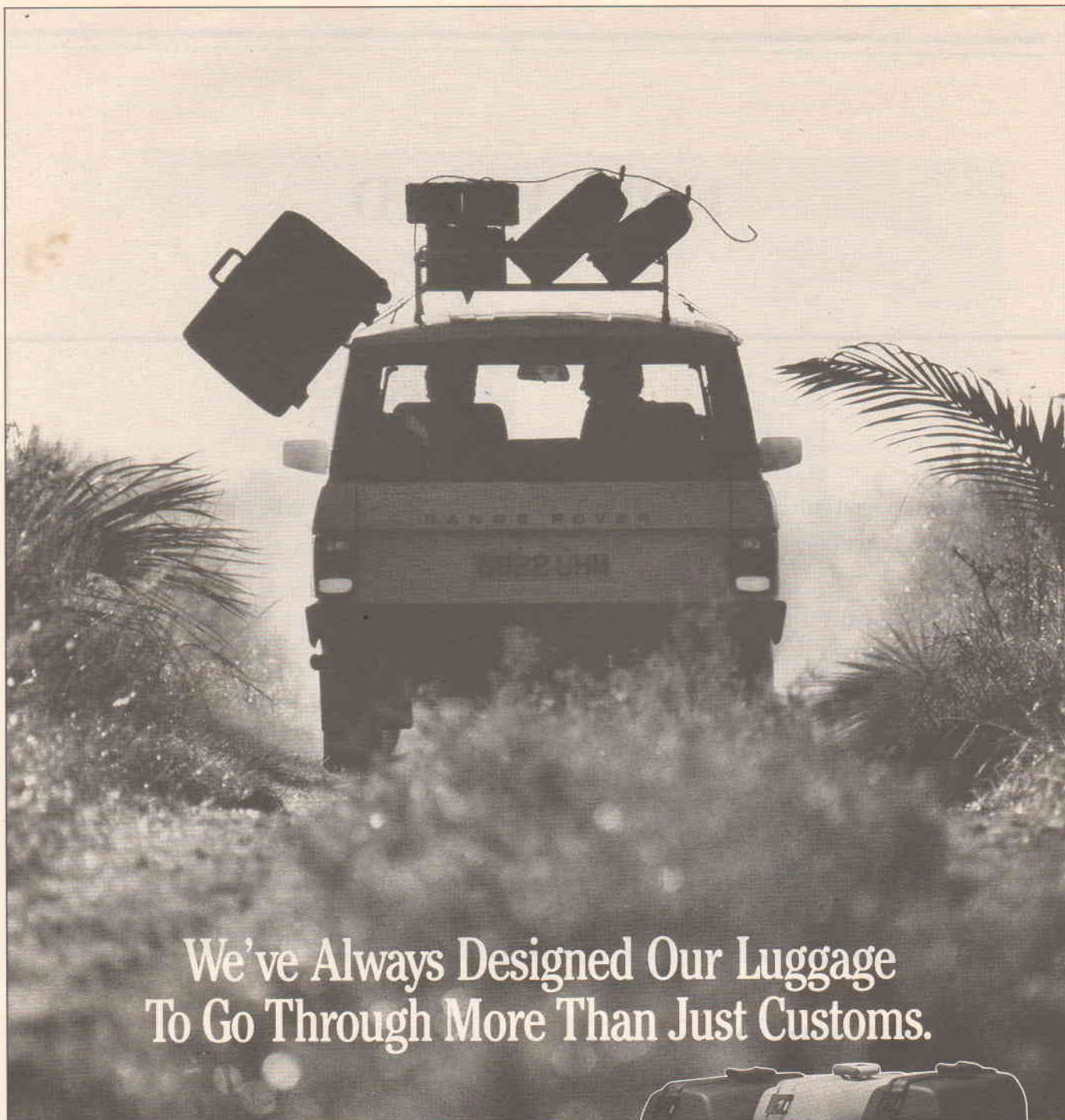
The School, established 175 years ago, is still going strong and, one hopes, it will still be around in another 175 years.

A HISTORY OF THE PENANG FREE SCHOOL

175 years ago, an institution was founded on the Prince of Wales Island to **"provide for the education of such children as would be brought up in the idleness and the consequent vice, and without any means of obtaining instructions either in useful learning or in manual employment and to implant in them the early habits of industry, order and good conduct."**

Thus was born the Penang Free School which till today still flourishes as one of the great educational institutions in Malaysia. Under the leadership of Rev. R. S. Hutchings, a proposal for the establishment of a school in the Prince of Wales Island was submitted to the then Governor. In response to the proposal, a Committee headed by Rev. Hutchings was appointed to consider ways and means of implementing what was desired. Between 1818 and 1824 a sum of \$10,867 was subscribed. The Governor promised, on behalf of the East India Company, a donation of \$1,500.00, a monthly subscription of \$200.00 and a piece of ground known as the Church Square, as a site for the erection of the school buildings.



THE OLD BUILDING

According to the original scheme, there were to be two schools — one for boys and the other for girls as well as boarders and day scholars for both. The school was to be conducted "on the plan adopted by Mr. Bell in Madras". It was called "Free School" not because free education was given but on the principle of education free from all religious and racial prejudices. It was stipulated "that great care should be taken that the prejudices of parents averse to the Christian religion should not by any means be violated". Fees were paid by those who could afford it but those who could not were to be maintained and clothed at the expense of the school.

On 21st October 1816, the Penang Free School, housed on rented premises at Love Lane, was opened. Started as a day school for boys, it has continued to this day. A girls' school was opened in 1817, stopped from 1821 to 1828, reopened again but was finally closed in 1851.

In 1821, the school shifted to Farquhar Square on an expanse of land granted by the East India Company. From then till 1897 the school consisted of a number of small buildings covering practically the whole of the site then in the possession of the school. In that same year (1897), half of the former building nearest to St. Georges' Church was opened. In 1907, the other half was added. On completion of the present building, the other less significant buildings were, with one exception, demolished. Thus for the first time, the school had a football pitch of its own.



THE OLD PREMISES

In August 1817, the enrolment was 49. In 1830, there were 90 and in 1840, 80. During the next 5 years, the enrolment rose to 173. This great increase was due to the sudden awakening on the part of the populace to the value of an English Education. By 1860 there were 296 boys; 1870, 274; 1880, 572; and in 1890, 789. On reaching this number, the school had to turn away a number of applications each year.

The first Headmaster of the School was Mr. J. Cox from Madras, India. He resigned in 1821. From then till 1853, none of the Headmasters seemed to have any professional training. However, from 1853 to 1871, an elementary school master from England, Mr. John Clerk, was appointed as the Headmaster.

In order to upgrade the standards of the school, it was felt that a university trained man should be appointed as the Headmaster. Thus, Mr W. Hargreaves became the Headmaster in 1891. With his university background plus his dedication, he managed to upgrade the academic standards of the School. During his tenure as Headmaster, 10 boys won the Queen's scholarship - the earliest (1893) being Ung Bok Hoay. Mr. Hargreaves was succeeded by Mr. R. H. Pinhorn in 1904. It was during his term of about 21 years as Headmaster that Mr. Pinhorn, assisted by his very able assistant, Mr. H. R. Chessman, put in so much effort that the School began to take some semblance to what it is today.

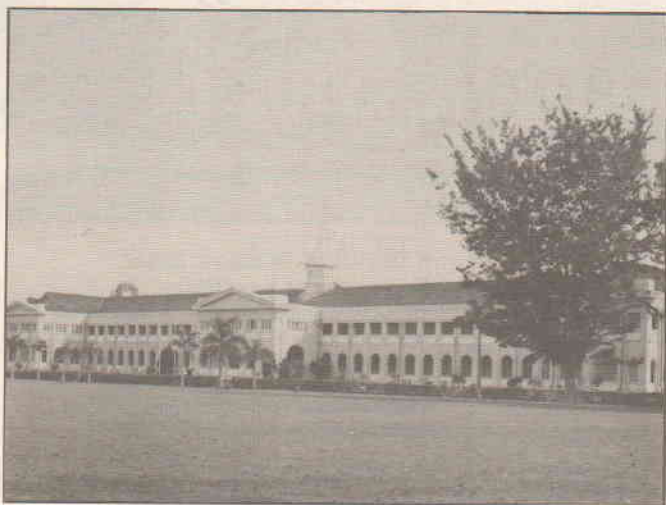

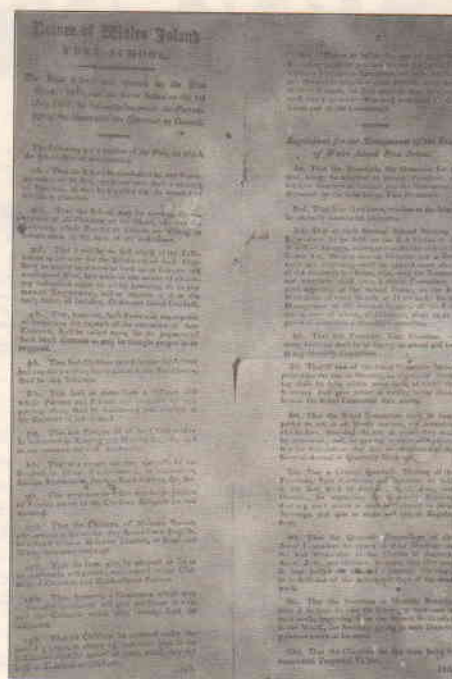

Undoubtedly, one of the most important events in the history of the School was the change in management which occurred during Mr. Pinhorn's tenure. Due to the increase in enrolment, the School was badly overcrowded by 1919. On 1st January 1920, the School was taken over by the government and a new site in Green Lane was chosen by the Government and construction of the new (present) building began in 1924.

FREE SCHOOL CHARTER

EXTRACT FROM FREE SCHOOL CHARTER

PRINCE OF WALES ISLAND FREE SCHOOL

The boys school was opened on the 21st October 1816, and the Girls School on the 1st July 1817, by subscription under the Patronage of the Honourable Governor in Council.

The following is the outline of the plan, on which the Establishment was founded.

- 1st That the school be conducted by an Superintendent or Master, presiding over such a number of teachers, as may be required for the number of children admitted.
- 2nd That the School may be opened to the reception of all children on the Island, of every description, whole parents or friends are willing to submit them to the rules of the Institution.
- 3rd That it will be the first object of the Institution to provide for the Education of such Children as would be otherwise bred up in Idleness and consequent Vice, and without any means of obtaining instruction either in useful Learning or in any manual Employment, and to implant in them the early habits of Industry, Order and Good Conduct.
- 4th That, however, such Parents as are capable of supporting the expense of the education of their Children, that be called upon for the payment of such small demands as may be thought proper to be required.
- 5th That such children as reside near the School and can daily and regularly attend at the stated hours, shall be day Scholars.
- 6th That such as come from a distance and whole Parents and Friends are incapable of supporting them, shall be maintained and clothed at the Expense of the School.
- 7th That any Part, or all of the Children may be instructed in Reading and Writing English and in the common rules of Arithmetic.
- 8th That at a proper age they may also be instructed in useful Employments, as Carpenters, Smiths, Shoemakers, Tailors, Book Binders, etc.
- 9th That great care be taken that the prejudice of Parents averse to the Christian Religion be not violated.
- 10th That the Children of Malayan Parents who are not desirous that they should learn English, be instructed by a Malayan Teacher, to Read and Write their own language.
- 11th That the same plan be adopted as far as circumstances will permit, with regard to the Children of Chooliah and Hindcoftanae Parents.
- 12th That, however, a Committee which may be hereafter appointed, will give directions in what way the Children which they admit, shall be instructed.
- 13th That no Children be admitted under the age of 4 years, or above 14, and none kept in the Institution after the age of 16 years, unless they are kept as Teachers or Affilante.
- 14th That at or therefore the age of 14 years, it be endeavoured to procure for the Children Situations, as Servants to European, or with Artificers, or otherwise to dispose of them with the approbation of their friends, in such ways as may be though most likely to render them most beneficial to themselves and to the Community.

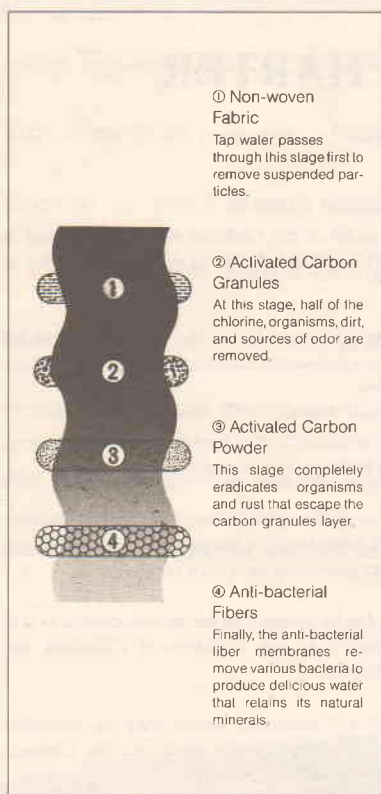

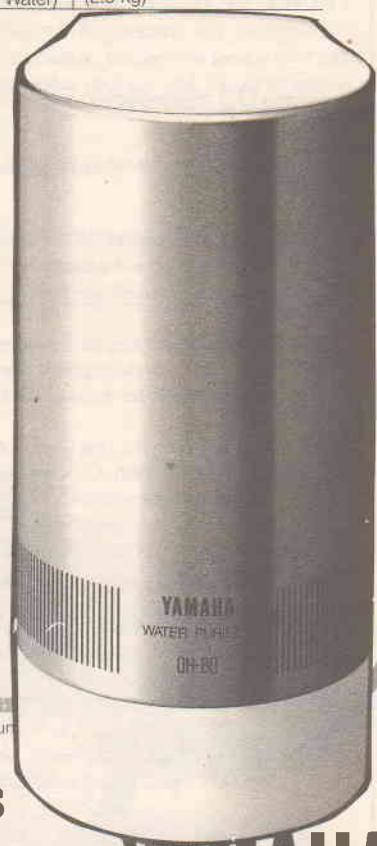

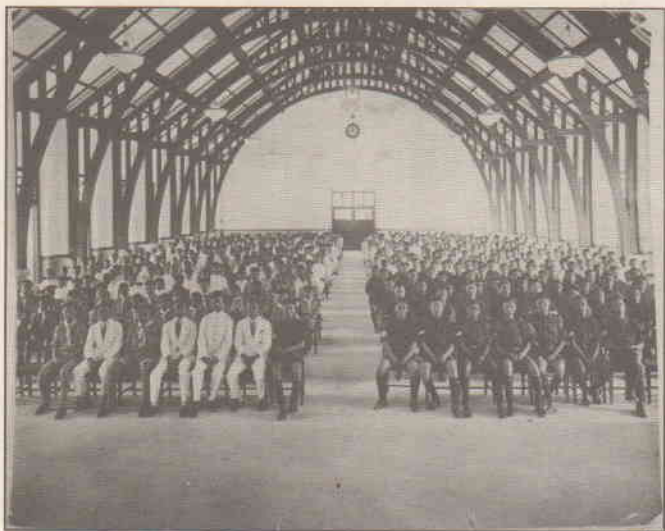

THE OLD HALL

Mr. Pinhorn's list of achievements includes (in chronological order)

- 1905 Formation of the School Games Club for football.
- 1906 Formation of the 1st School Cadet Corps by Mr. Hamilton who also introduced Gardening, Basketry and Singing.
- 1909 Publication of the First School Magazine.
- 1911 School's First Athletics Meet.
- 1912 Formation of the Debating Society.
- 1913 Introduction of Cricket, Hockey and Badminton.
- 1915 Scouting introduced by Mr. H. R. Cheeseman.
- 1916 School's 100th Anniversary.
- 1923 Formation of the Old Free School Association with Mr Yeoh Guan Seok as its President and Mr. R. H. Pinhorn as its Patron.
- 1924 Commencement of the building of the present School Building, completed in 1928.

Meanwhile, it was decided to rename the old school in Farquhar Street as "Hutchings School" (now the Penang Museum) which was to serve as a feeder School. 1926 saw the construction of the Art Room and 1927, the pavilion. The new Free School buildings in Green Lane (now called Jalan Masjid Negeri) was officially declared open by the Resident Councillor of Penang, Mr. Ralph Scott, on 9th January 1928 during the Headmastership of Mr. D. R. Swaine.

During the period that Mr. Swaine was in office, the extra curricular activities underwent radical changes. The House system was introduced. Pupils were organised under 5 Houses bearing the names of people who have contributed to the fame and progress of the School - these being the Houses of Hargreaves, Pinhorn, Cheeseman, Hamilton and Wu Lien Teh. (Wu Lien Teh was named after one of the "Grand Old Lady's" noblest sons, the late Dr. Wu Lien Teh who studied in the golden era of the School and was awarded the Queen's Scholarship in 1896. Dr. Wu went on to become the plague specialist to the League of Nations). The House System plays a part in nurturing loyalty and a devotion to duty among the pupils as each pupil is attached to the House until he leaves the School.

Free School owes its greatness to Headmasters like Hargreaves, Pinhorn, and Hamilton whose vision and foresight have made it a school rich in traditions and vast in its possibilities.

Likewise, in no small measure, dedicated staff through the decades too have contributed much to the school's success.

The first attempt to introduce Science to the School curriculum was made in 1923. Unfortunately it failed. In 1932, after the completion of the Science Block, a special Science class was started in 1936 for the London and Queen's Scholarship Matriculation candidates who had no opportunity to study the subject in lower standards. In addition, a preparatory class for students who had intentions of taking up medical studies in higher institutions of learning was started.

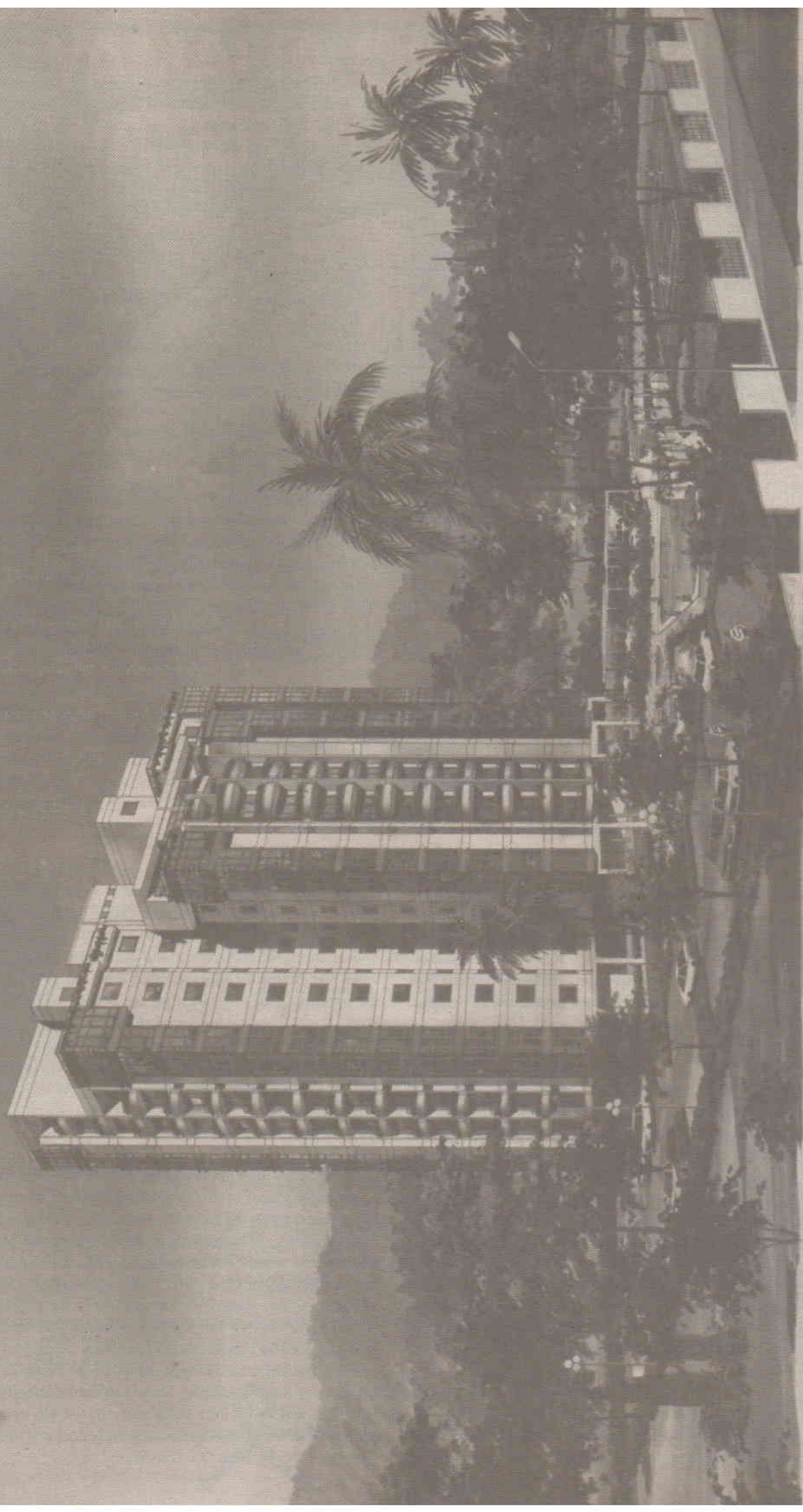
The School has, since its inception, taken a liberal view of the function of education and has been a place not only for the acquisition of academic knowledge but also for character building. Thus, the 1930s saw an increase of extra-curricular activities like Volleyball, Basketball, Gymnastics, and Rugby together with Swimming.

Since Mr. Pinhorn's time, the School has always emphasised the importance of recreational activities - the objective being to inculcate a spirit of comradeship, sportsmanship and to keep them away from the bad influences of their days. It is with these intentions that an extra Games section was started to cater for these needs. Added to this was the implementation of the "Additional Sports System" whereby it was compulsory for everybody to participate in sports. This ruling has stayed till today.

It was also during the 1930s that the senior local teachers from Free School were promoted as Headmasters of its feeder schools. The first to be appointed was Mr. S. M. Zainal Abidin in 1936. In January 1939 Mr. Tan Kar Liew and Mr. Tan Kok Kee were appointed Headmasters of Westlands and Hutchings Schools respectively.

The war years of 1941 to 1945 saw the entire organization of the School being disrupted by the Japanese Occupation when the school was occupied by the Indian National Liberation Army. Like many other institutions, the school suffered losses in books, furniture, equipment and apparatus. On 4th October 1945, the Acting Headmaster, Mr. Koay Khye Teong, started the uphill task of rehabilitating the School with a roll of 603 boys. It was then handed over to Mr. N. R. Miller and later Mr. J. N. Davies. By the time Mr. D. Roper became Headmaster, conditions in the school had already returned to normal. The degree to which it had been restored to its former glory was convincingly illustrated by the Cambridge results of 1946 when the school scored 78.5% passes.

Mr. P. F. Howitts's appointment in 1950 co-incided with the commencement of Sixth Form Education for Science and Arts to provide students the necessary foundation for higher education in universities. The growth in the scope of the Sixth Form Society was largely due to the work of Mr. J. E. Todd who was the Headmaster in 1951. Mr. Todd organized two Sixth Form Societies - the Parnassus Society for Arts pupils and the Aristotelian Society for Science students. To cater for the growing need for private research, a Library Fund was launched in 1953, the objective being to establish the Pinhorn Memorial Library for Sixth-Formers. Owing to the generosity of many Old Free and financial assistance from the Government, the Pinhorn Memorial Library was officially declared open on 19th October 1955 by Mrs. Ooi Kee Wan.

As a result of increasing needs, an extension, which included a residential hostel, was built in 1957. The Sixth Form Block was officially declared open on 21st October 1958 by the late Y. T. M. Tunku Abdul Rahman Putra, himself an Old Free. Since then, Free School has been and is the Centre of Sixth Form Education in Northern Malaysia.

In 1950, the School Band was formed. It was upgraded during Mr. Visvanathan's time when new and better instruments were added. Today, it brings much pride to the School by performing on grand occasions like the "Penang Music Festival". Then, there is the Music and Drama Company, which although formed in 1922, made its debut only in 1958. Today it is still active and staged the popular musical "The King and I" in 1990.

Mr. J. M. B. Hughes succeeded Mr. Todd in 1957. Under his leadership, Free School came through a difficult transitional period. The Razak Report in 1956 had brought about great organisational changes in the School. Under the new Educational Policy in 1957, Free School became a National Type fully assisted Secondary School - no longer run by the Government but by a newly constituted Board of Governors but with the buildings still remaining the property of the Government. Since that year, the Malaysian Secondary Schools Entrance Examination was used as the basis for selection. Through this selective examination the School was able to get the "cream" from the primary schools.

The system of automatic promotions was introduced in 1957. Prior to this, examinations were held and failures were retained for an extra year. In 1957, pupils were entered for the Lower Certificate of Education (LCE) Examination and in 1959 the Malaysian Certificate of Education (MCE). In conformity with these public examinations, efforts were made in 1957 to implement the study of the National Language in the School. To instil greater interest among the students in the National Language, the National Language Society was formed.

Between 1957 and 1965, more extra-curricular activities were introduced. The Chess Club and the Stamp Club were formed in 1958. The Electronics Club had its beginning in 1962 to encourage the construction of simple equipment such as radios and amplifiers. The Gymnastics Club was also revived during this period to restore interest in Gymnastics.

The abolition of the Malayan Secondary Schools Entrance Examinations and the introduction of the comprehensive type of education for Lower Secondary Classes in 1965 meant the end of the previous system of selective intake of students. This change, of course, reflected the change in the National Education System.

Since the loss of Government status, there has been a lack of provision of facilities for the School. The Free School Development Fund was launched in 1963 and one of the proposed projects was the "swimming pool". A Food and Fun-fair held in April 1963 netted \$18,622.00. However, the swimming pool project was shelved in favour of a new library. This project became a reality on 29th December 1969 when it was officially opened by the late Y. T. M. Tunku Abdul Rahman Putra Al-haj. It was named "Kutub Khanah Tunku" in his honour. The late Tunku, an Old Free himself, donated \$100,000.00 towards the construction of the library and his last visit to the Alma Mater in 1990 was in conjunction with the

celebration of the Library's 20th Anniversary.

1966, undoubtedly, was a very important year for the school as it held its Sesquicentenary Celebrations. In the same year the Records Room was set up by an Old Free, Mr. Tan Kar Liew with the help of Mr. Yeoh Oon Huat, the purpose being to keep as well as to display the School's historical records and documents. The proposal was made by Mr. Tan Boon Lin, the first Asian Headmaster in Free School. 1967 marked the debut of the Tunku Putra House in honour of the late Tunku.

In 1970, the Records Room was unfortunately renovated to make way for an extra classroom. The 1970s saw new additions to the infrastructure of the School. In 1972 a new Science Block, an Industrial Arts Block and a new Hostel Block were added. With the completion of the new hostel, the old hostel was converted into the present Sixth Form Block.

During Mr. Goon Fatt Chee's term as Headmaster, the gate leading to the Headmaster's quarters and the pond were built. Well-wishers like the Choong family, Mr. Teh Choon Beng and Mr. Lim Hock Seng made the above possible. Mr. Goon Fatt Chee's time also saw the erection of the arch designed by the Senior Art Teacher, Mr. Tan Teong Kooi. The Arch was officially opened by the late Datuk Ch'ng Eng Hye on 21st October 1978. The late Datuk Ch'ng, also an Old Free, had very generously donated towards its construction. In the same year another hostel block was built. Mr. Goon's era also saw the beginning of the Beautification Club. However, it had a very short life span.

The 1960's and 1970's witnessed the gradual transition in the medium of instruction from English Language to Bahasa Malaysia. The Lower Certificate of Education (LCE); the Malaysian Certificate of Education (MCE) and the Higher School Certificate (HSC) examinations were replaced by the Sijil Rendah Pelajaran (SRP - 1977), Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM - 1979) and Sijil Tinggi Pelajaran (STPM - 1981) Examinations respectively.

In 1988 during Mr. Krishna Iyer's final year as the Headmaster, the Form One students found themselves on the threshold of a new academic era with the implementation of KBSM (Integrated Curriculum for Secondary Schools) a secondary equivalent of

KBSR. The following year saw the teaching of a new subject "Kemahiran Hidup" (Living Skills) to the First Formers. This change coincided with the coming of the new Headmaster, Mr. Goh Hooi Beng, who assumed office in late 1988. During this period, too, the 2 new blocks of classrooms and Science Laboratories were completed. Under Mr. Goh's guidance, the School was once again turned into a one-session School. December 1990 saw the beginning of the 2-semester system.

The present administration made further expansion of extra-curricular activities like the "Body-Building Club", the "Young Frees Enterprise", the "General Knowledge Club", the revival of the "Beautification Club" (now called "Kelab Keceriaan" or "Friends of the Environment") and the "Archives". As evident from the growth and development of the School, Free School has a reputation of providing a well-balanced education. Emphasis is not only confined to academic achievements but also sporting pursuits. Thus, it is not surprising that Free School's many talented and dedicated sons and daughters have brought much honour and glory to Malaysia. For example, in 1958 three members of the Thomas Cup Team were Old Frees - Eddy Choong, Johnny Heah Hock Aun and Lim Say Hup. Eddy Choong was a four-time champion of the All-England Open. In 1959 Free School achieved the very creditable feat of winning the inaugural Yang Di Pertuan Agong's Cup for the Champion School in badminton in the Federation of Malaya.



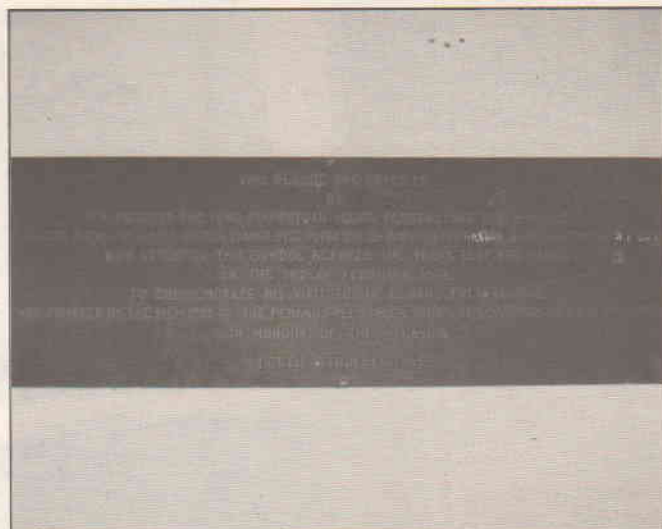

In 1965 Lee Hock Siew was selected to represent Malaysia in shooting at the SEAP Games. In 1967 Tai Lung Khim represented Malaysia in the 3rd International Schoolboys Badminton Championships in Sri Lanka. The School Hockey Team has, since the 1960s, emerged as the MSSPP Champions for the Under-15s and Under-18s - a position it has held without break for 27 Years. Hockey players like Koe Chong Jin, Takbir Ahmad and Ow Soon Kooi represented Malaysia in the Olympics. In 1988 Jeyanthi Kandayan was selected to represent Malaysia in Hockey at the XV SEA Games. Edward Jaipal represented Malaysia in the ASEAN and Asian Athletics Meet. Mohd Amril bin Junid represented Malaysian Youth in an Asian Juniors Football Tournament in China in 1990.

The accomplishment of great feats and achievements in the sports and games arena, are equally matched by the vast number of brilliant and outstanding figures the "Grand Old Lady" has produced. The large galaxy of Old Frees who have made an indelible mark on Malaysian and Singapore Societies is testimony of the School's great success. Among them is the Raja of Perlis, Tuanku Syed Putra Jamalullail, who became the 3rd Yang Di Pertuan Agong. His Highness was educated at the School during the 1930s and paid a great tribute to the Alma Mater when he visited the School on 4th January 1961. Another distinguished Old Free is the late Tunku who became the first Prime Minister of Malaysia. He was also the "driving force" behind the achievement of Independence for Malaya in 1957. Tun Dr. Lim Chong Eu (Queen's Scholar 1937) was the longest-serving Chief Minister of Penang. Tengku Ahmad Rithaudeen, another Old Free, was the Malaysian Minister of Foreign Affairs. The present Datuk Bandar of Kuala Lumpur, Elyas Omar, is also the product of the Alma Mater while another Old Boy, Datuk Haji Omar b. Mohd Hashim is the former Deputy Director-General of Education. Yang arif Tan Sri Dato' Seri Eusoffe Abdoolcader was the former Supreme Court Judge of Malaysia.

The School has also produced many capable men in every area of public and private enterprise in Singapore, amongst Leaders of Government, the Judiciary, the Civil Service and in the various professions. Mr. Justice Tan Ah Tah, Queen's Scholar 1924, was the first Acting Asian Chief Justice of Singapore. Mr. A. V. Winslow, our 1934 Queen's Scholar, was the Solicitor-General before being elevated to the Bench. Mr. J. W. D. Ambrose who was the 1928 Queen's Scholar, also became a High Court Judge. Mr. Justice Wee Chong Jin was the Chief

Justice of the Republic of Singapore from 1963 till his retirement this year, a post he held for 28 years. Mr. Tan Boon Teik has been and still is the Attorney-General of Singapore since 1965.

Free School is truly a national asset. Since its foundation, it has enriched the public life of both Malaysia and Singapore by equipping men to serve both countries with distinction. A roll-call of successful Frees who have made their mark in the different facets of society would be legion.

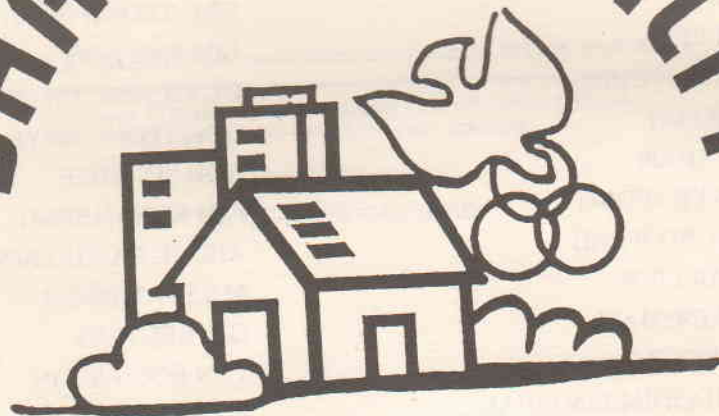

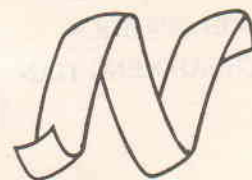
